Chair's Opening Remarks

On behalf of the Local Pension Board, I am delighted to be able to present the Annual Report of the Local Pension Board of the Dorset County Pension Fund. This report covers the period from 1 April 2024 to 31 March 2025, to align with the Fund's Annual Report.

As a defined benefit scheme for our 80,000+ members, the Dorset County Pension Fund pays scheme members a retirement income based on salary and the number of years worked for the employer. The Fund invests contributions made by employers into long term investments, and though the market will always fluctuate, investment performance does not affect members' pensions. As of 31 March 2025, the Fund contained £4.1 billion of assets.

Throughout the year we have complemented the Administering Authority, ensuring compliance with the Public Service Pensions Act, the LGPS Advisory Board, the Chartered Institute of Public Finance and Accounting (CIPFA) and The Pensions Regulator. The Board has over the course of the year received regular updates on the implementation of the McCloud Remedy, which came into force on 1 October 2023 and was, and continues to be, the biggest pension administration challenge for 2024-25.

The Board has no concerns about the Dorset County Pension Fund or its Administration, though it continues to be concerned over the impact of delays from our software supplier in making the necessary changes required to the administration system to deal with administering the McCloud remedy and the impact this has had on the administration staff and the implementation of the new pensions payroll. We will continue to support the Pensions Manager, and we are confident she will continue to administer the Fund efficiently and effectively despite ongoing pressures.

I would like to place on record the Board's appreciation for the support and transparent advice of the officers. Further information about the Board's work can be found on the website [Local Pension Board](#). Despite the continual challenges, I am looking forward to another successful year ahead.

Introduction

The Local Pension Board helps ensure that the Fund is managed and administered effectively and efficiently and complies with the code of practice on the governance and administration of local government pension schemes issued by the Pension Regulator and with due regard to guidance issued by government, The Pensions Regulator and the LGPS Advisory Board.

The function of the Board as defined by sections 5 (1) and (2) of the Public Service Pensions Act 2013 is to assist the Scheme Manager:

- to secure compliance with the LGPS regulations and any other legislation relating to the governance and administration of the LGPS
- to secure compliance with requirements imposed in relation to the LGPS by the Pensions Regulator
- in such other matters as the LGPS regulations may specify
- to secure the effective and efficient governance and administration of the LGPS for the DCPF, and
- to provide the Scheme Manager with such information as it requires to ensure that any member of the Local Pension Board or person to be appointed to the Local Pension Board does not have a conflict of interest
- Local Pension Boards are constituted entirely under the Public Service Pensions Act 2013 and are not local authority committees.

Role of the Pension Board

The Pension Board is responsible for:

- Scrutinising the progress of actions to meet the performance objectives of the Pension Fund
- Reviewing and monitoring the training plan of the Pensions Board and elected members and officers with delegated responsibilities for the governance, management and administration of the Pension Fund
- Reviewing and monitoring the performance of external business partners, including the pensions administration service, the actuary, the custodian and the investment consultant
- Reviewing and monitoring the Risk Register and risk monitoring of scheme employers
- Reviewing the implementation of revised policies and procedures, including the administering discretions
- Reviewing the compliance of projects commissioned by the Pension Fund Committee, including the Triennial Valuation of the Pension Fund
- Ensuring pension rules and regulations are being complied with, when officers are making decisions on pension matters
- Scrutinising data quality
- Reviewing internal audit reports
- Assisting in the development of improved customer services
- Reviewing compliance of Investment Managers with Investment Management Agreements; and
- Reviewing progress of agreed actions to address finding from any review of the Pension Fund activities.

Membership of the Pension Board

The Pension Board consists of an independent Chair and 8 members and constituted as follows

- 4 employer representatives
- 4 scheme membership representatives

The Pension Board meets four times a year.
